On June 23, 2017, Dr. Andy Furco, University of Minnesota, hosted three online forums with ACES Partners to determine potential collaborative issues. Analysis of the input identified five issues from the sessions that ACES should consider:

1) Community involvement: What does it mean to conduct scholarship outside of the academy? How do we attract partnering community members to become ACES members? How do we engage community members in ACES Issues?

2) Politics of engagement: How do we address growing criticism of engaged work and the characterization of it as promoting a liberal, agenda? How do we document political value?

3) Taxonomy of engagement: How do we coordinate the multiple engagement agendas and priorities? (finding a way to clarify the different definitions, purposes. intentions for engaged work)

4) The engagement scholarship life cycle: Examining the developmental phases of engagement advancement. (different people at different stages of development in their CES work confront different issues; is there a development taxonomy we might develop)

5) Rewarding engaged scholarship: Supporting and rewarding scholars for engaged work. (new metrics for assessing impact in CES)

The ACES Board agreed to cancel the September 25th Roundtable Workshop and to plan a face-to-face meeting at the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis campus on January 10-11, 2017. This will be the 2018 Annual Membership Meeting of ACES Members.

You will be receiving a short survey to help us determine the link these issues have in relationship to ACES membership work and values. Please complete the survey .

We will review the status of the five issues identified with partners. During this meeting we will develop an action plan for one issue area that will be endorsed by ACES and partners of ACES.
